





Marilyn Northmore, chairperson of the Garden Club, introduced the two who are well known for their floral artistry and their "Dare to be Different" business.





My wife died in June. We had been married for 58 years.


I am an octogenarian retired gynaecologist and ordained minister, working through the challenges of grief.




Fig 11 Fig 10

Great Britain, for example, at one stage, did not show the name of the town from where the postal item originated, but instead each post office was given a number as a cancellation (Fig 17)

During the Third Reich inflation in Germany ran wild and the value of stamps changed weekly, hence over-prints became a feature with the German stamps (Fig. 18). The stamps of Nederland also went through a period showing values on very plain stamps in large print. (Fig. 19 and 20)



What with their accents, I expected what I understood to be a North East UK-something called 'Peace' puddin'. It being Christmas time, I presumed this would be Christmas cake (hopefully filled with coins), topped with ice cream! Understandably, I was a bit baffled when by the end of the meal my favourite pudding didn't feature at all. Trifle was served instead.

Laughing, Pauline explained that pease is an Old English word for peas, and that pease puddin' had been served with the roast as a mash made from yellow split peas and pickled pork juice. I would later learn that cold pork slices in a bun with a dollop of pease puddin', is a fabulous meal too! "Pease be with you."

"Slinging Black Labels" in the Victoria Club! An embellished account of a true story. During the 1980s I joined the KZN provincial education department based in Pietermaritzburg. It was obvious why the city had been dubbed 'the last outpost of the British Empire!' Besides the language, the town abounded with red-bricked Victorian architecture. My office was situated across the road overlooking possibly the last vestige of the Victorian era in Pietermaritzburg, The Victoria Club. The club was situated in Longmarket Street (now Langalibalele Street) since 1897 (until its mergence and relocation with Maritzburg Country Club in 1997, now called Victoria Country Club). My colleague. Jack, had the privilege of once setting foot through the hallowed portals. The then century old club was a testament to the aura that surrounded this bastion and last vestige of colonialism in South Africa.

This saga started one day when after work I invited Jack for a drink at our local. "Johnny Walker ... Black Label Whisky, you say. Mmmm ... I must remember that ... on the rocks, too" Jack exclaimed taking a whiff.

Victoria Club, as a guest of book publishers. The archetypical exclusive gentleman's club, steeped in its colonial heritage, even had a special rear entrance for workers and tradesmen, and believe it or not, 'wimmen'! (Jane Raphaely, SA magazine publishing dovenne of Fair Lady and Cosmopolitan fame, once caused a huge fuss by daring to enter the club through the front entrance!!!)

So it was to this upper-class club that my colleague took himself off to lunch. Later when he returned, he sat down in his chair and burst out laughing. Eventually, in between chuckles, he blurted, "You'll never guess what happened?" going on to recount his lunch time experience...

On his arrival at the club. Jack said he was ushered through. by a stern-faced uniformed maitre'd, to the lounge where his two hosts were seated. After introductions drinks were offered. The hosts placed their usual order of gins with an equally stern-faced waiter, sporting a red fez. Jack said at that moment he remembered the expensive Black Label whisky he and I had savoured the week before (besides which, he thought, these geezers were paying!)

"And for you ... Sir," enquired stern face.

"Make mine a Black Label." (A drink he presumed befitted the ambience of the place.)

"Very good Sir."

"Oh... and make it on the rocks ... on the rocks, please!" to which the waiter briefly faltered mid-stride, and then continued on his errand.

In his mind's eye, Jack envisaged the fine malt whisky, immersed in ice cubes in a Waterford crystal glass! Instead, placed in front of him was a tankard of beer, filled to the brim with ice cubes!!! He had been served Carling Black Label Beer, on the rocks!!! Recovering his composure he promptly proposed a toast (with a clink of glasses, and a clunk on a beer mug). "Here, Here!" came the reply. The very fine lunch proceeded without further incident, washed down with a fine wine.

So, whenever I have a whisky, I envisage my bemused colleague sitting in front of a frosty tankard of beer, filled to the brim with ice cubes. If it had happened anywhere else probably no one would have cared a toss at all. But that it happened in a hoity-toity club, was indeed a real hoot, what!

And when I see the nine, I think of the lepers our Saviour cleansed, and, nine out of the ten, didn't even thank him.


When I see the ten, I think of the ten commandments,

#### **Woodward Maurice "Tex" Ritter**

(January 12, 1905 – January 2, 1974) was a pioneer of American Country music, a popular singer and actor from the mid-1930s into the 1960s.

Woodward Maurice Ritter was born on January 12, 1905, in Texas to Martha Elizabeth (*née* Matthews) and James Everett Ritter. He grew up on his family's farm, after graduating with honours, he entered the University of Texas in 1922 to study pre-law and major in government, political science, and economics. However, he was drawn to a musical career and moved to New York appearing in Broadway shows, later moving to LA and enjoying success in movies.

Ritter had a heart attack and died in Nashville in 1974, ten days before his 69th birthday. He was survived by his wife and two sons. Tex Ritter's son, John, became famous as an actor, playing Jack Tripper in the sitcom Three's Company.



#### **FACTS ABOUT EYES**

- 1. The brain is the only organ in our bodies more complex than the eye.
- 2. Over 1 in 8 males are colour blind.
- **3**. Over 80% of the brain's processing is from our vision.
- 4. Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed with dyslexia, ADHD and other learning difficulties
- 5. There are NO pain nerves inside the eye, you could have serious eve conditions, such as glaucoma, and not know it until you have permanent eye damage.
- 6. Eyes heal quickly, it takes only about 48 hours for a minor scratch to heal
- 7. Every second, your eyes change focus over 50 times.
- 8. There are over 1 million nerves connecting each eye to the brain.
- **9.** Even though the retina detects only 3 colours, red. blue and green, we can distinguish over 10 million different colours.
- 10. The front of the eye, the cornea, is the only part of the body that receives its oxygen directly from the air, not the lungs
- 11. Only 1/6 of your eyeball is visible.

- 12. In a pitch black night, eyes can detect a candle flame 14 miles away.
- 13. The iris (coloured part of the eye) has 256 distinct features, whereas fingerprints only have 40.
- 14. When concentrating, most people only partially blink, causing dry spots and redness on the eyes
- **15.** In a typical lifetime, you will see over 24 million images of the world around you.
- **16.** The retina is made up of 2 types of nerves, known as 'rods and cones'. Rods are responsible for night vision and seeing shapes, whereas cones provide sharp vision and decipher colours.
- 17. The average person blinks 12 times a minute.
- **18**. The cornea of a shark is nearly identical to that of a human, and it has even been used in human eye surgery!
- 19. Contracting in less than 1/100th of a second, the eye is the fastest contracting muscle in the body.
- **20.** The 'red eye' seen in flash photography, is due to the retina being densely packed with blood vessels.
- **21.** The cornea is the only tissue in the body that does not have blood vessels.
- 22. The human eye weighs approximately just under an ounce.

## **FASHION** - The Last 100 Years

Fashion trends come and go – in many ways what we wear reflects the world we live in.

Almost 100 years have passed since the **Roaring Twenties.** A time characterized by a newfound joie de vivre, which was really celebrated during this time. Gold and glitter, sequins and feather boas, flapper dresses, headbands and, for the men, dandy suits, suspenders and felt hats were the hallmarks of contemporary fashion. The waist of the woman was hidden under short, straight flapper dresses, the hair was cut off. The androgynous look reached its peak here, after all, at this time the woman also acquired a completely new position in society – she even smoked now, but only with a cigarette holder, of course.

The party mood of the twenties evaporated with the economic crisis of the time. The style icon of this time was without doubt Marlene Dietrich, who also made the long wide trousers presentable at this time, which later became the cult Marlene trousers.

Fashion radically changed in the **forties**; due to the war. There was no material available for dazzling and elaborate dresses, so women became inventive and usually made their own clothes. New clothes were made from the old, and to save on material, the clothes were especially figure-hugging.

What was particularly noticeable at that time were red lips. An accessory that was supposed to defy the dreary environment.

Fashion in the **fifties**, came a little closer to that of the twenties – the fun came back. Christian Dior already laid the foundations for the typical rockabilly of the fifties at the end of the 1940s, when he put wide cut skirts with large petticoats in the shop windows, along with tight blouses that created the "New Look". A new style was also on the agenda for men. The suit gave way to casual jeans in the younger generations. In addition, white T-shirts and leather jackets shaped the image of the men on the streets –very James Dean and Elvis Presley!

The Swinging Sixties, characterized by protest movements. The rather romantic fashion of the fifties was unceremoniously discarded; instead, people took to the streets in A-line dresses and miniskirts. A time of Mary Quant and Twiggy.

The hippie movement conquered society during the **seventies.** Striking colours, patterns and accessories reflected the feeling of freedom and individualism of the time. Men and women squeezed themselves into tight tops and tight jeans, bell bottoms of course. Hair; worn long by both sexes, and most young men favoured facial hair, particularly moustaches.

Some may say fashion took a downward turn in the **eighties**; shoulder pads, balloon pants, puffed sleeves, perms and neon-coloured XL pullovers with leggings — combination at will allowed, often clashing colours! Also a time of 'tracksuits' in synthetic fabric.

In the **nineties**; fashion divided into different groups from sporty, preppy to grunge, anything goes and with the youth depends very much on the style of music! This has continued in the **2000's**, although it needs to be said – semi nudity seems a favoured trend with many pop and film stars! There appears to be more value with shock value from the fashion houses than creating something new or reinventing something old.....





## **DEWORMING PETS:** Why it's important?

Deworming pets is generally not done often enough, probably because no pet parent likes to think of their dog or cat having worms. A pet can be taking parasite preventives with no signs of intestinal parasite infection and still be infected. Pets can harbour several kinds of worms, some of them deadly, and deworming regularly is as important as annual vaccinations.

Clinical signs of intestinal parasitic infection in pets can include diarrhoea, weight loss, scooting and anaemia - remember that infected pets may not always show these signs. Infected pets could contaminate their environment with parasites which are a potential risk to humans. Some parasites (such as hookworms and roundworms) are a serious risk to your family, especially children. Roundworms for example can cause eye, lung, heart and neurological symptoms in people.

This is why we recommend routine deworming of pets to protect them and your family.

#### So how do you prevent worms?

- •Remove faeces from your lawn daily.
- Prevent your pet from eating rodents and other small mammals.
- Routine flea control.
- Deworm pregnant pets before breeding, and again before whelping to help prevent infecting newborn puppies and kittens.
- •Dose your pets with regular Veterinary recommended deworming medication. There are several anti-worm medications available.

#### Deworming your pets: when should you do it?

- Puppies and kittens every 2 weeks until the age of 3 months (they may contract worms through their mother's milk), then once a month until the age of 6 months.
- Pets that roam a lot or eat bugs and rodents are considered high risk, as are pets that eat a raw diet. These pets should be dewormed monthly.
- •For pets 6 months and older, every 3 months.

NB!! Remember to treat for fleas at the same time that you deworm, otherwise the fleas will re-infect your dog or cat with tapeworm.





# Air Fryer Home Chef



#### Air fryer quiche Lorraine

#### Serves 4

Whisked eggs, bacon and cheese go perfectly with the tender, flakey pastry.

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry, just thawed
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 175g rindless bacon, cut into batons
- 1 brown onion, finely chopped
- 5 egg
- 125ml (1/2 cup) thickened cream
- 125ml (1/2 cup) milk
- 100g (1 cup) coarsely grated Swiss-style cheese Parsley or spring onions to sprinkle.

#### Origins

Quiche Lorraine is a French tart with a filling made of cream, eggs, and bacon or ham, in an open pastry case. It was little known outside the French region of Lorraine until the mid-20th century. As its popularity spread, nationally and internationally, the addition of cheese became commonplace, although it was criticised as inauthentic.

Quiches (sometimes spelled kiches), the name may derive from the German *Kuchen*, a term used for similar dishes. There are many varieties of quiche, with different regions creating their own. Originally a quiche Lorraine was baked with a bread-dough case similar to that now used for pizza, but the modern versions favour shortcrust of puff pastry.

#### **Variations**

Like pizza quiche is really only limited by imagination! But basically, using the cheese as the base you can experiment. Broccoli, cauliflower, green beans or spinach is an ideal way to increase your intake of vegetables. Types of cheese can also put on a spin, particularly if you like something with a 'bite'. Served with a salad or fresh, quiche provides a healthy choice for those cooking for one.

#### Method

Line a 4cm-high, 18cm (base measurement) round fluted tart tin with removable base with the puff pastry, pushing well into the base and side. Line the pastry with baking paper and fill with pastry weights or rice. Remove the sliding rack from the air fryer. Place the lined tart tin inside the rack. Slide rack back into the air fryer. Cook at 180C for 6 minutes. Remove the pastry weights or rice and the baking paper. Use a fork to prick the base of the pastry. Return to the air fryer and cook for a further 6 minutes or until the pastry feels dry to the touch. Set the pasty aside, in the rack, to cool slightly. Meanwhile, heat the oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the bacon and cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes or until starting to turn golden. Add the onion and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until bacon is crisp and onion is softened. Set aside to cool slightly.

Whisk the eggs, cream, and milk together in a medium bowl. Season with pepper. Spoon the bacon mixture into the pastry base. Sprinkle with the cheese. Pour over the egg mixture. Gently slide the rack back into the air fryer. Cook at 160C for 30 minutes or until filling is set. Set aside to cool slightly. Cut into slices to serve warm or cold.

# Horne Chef Olive oil, Rosemary and Salt Flat Bread

Make your own flatbread with olive oil, sea salt and fresh rosemary, then serve warm with cheese or your favourite dip.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 and 1/2 cups plain flour 1 tsp (1/2 sachet) dried instant yeast 1/2 tsp salt 3/4 cup warm water 2 tbsp Olive Oil 2 tsp chopped rosemary 1 tsp sea salt flakes

#### **METHOD**

Combine the flour, yeast and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and 1 tablespoon of the oil and stir until combined.


Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured board. Use floured hands to knead lightly until dough is smooth and doesn't stick anymore. Place the dough in a clean, greased large bowl. Cover with a clean tea towel and set aside for 1 hour or until doubled in size.

Preheat oven to 235C (215C fan-forced). Grease a large oven tray. Punch down dough. Use oiled hands to spread dough over prepared tray to a 32cm x 28cm rectangle. Brush with remaining oil and sprinkle with rosemary and sea salt flakes. Bake for 15 mins or until golden and base is crisp. Serve immediately.

**Note:** Use this basic recipe and add onions, peppers or additions of your choice.

# THE RISKY NEW TRUST LANDSCAPE – BENEFICIAL OWNERSHIP REGISTER REQUIREMENTS FOR TRUSTEES

The amendments to the Trust Property Control Act 58 of 1988 (the "TPCA"), which took effect on 1 April 2023, are inter alia, aimed at establishing registers of beneficial owners of trusts.

#### **Beneficial Ownership Register**

In an effort to address its grey listing status and to ensure that its regulatory environment aligns with international standards for combating money laundering and the financing of terrorism, South Africa amended the TPCA through the enactment of the General Laws (Anti Money-Laundering and Combating Terrorism Financing) Amendment Act 22 of 2022.

In terms of the amended legislation, trustees are now required to establish, record and maintain an up-to-date record of prescribed information relating to the founder, trustees and beneficiaries to the Master of the High Court via an electronic register. This submission must be completed manually on the Trusts Online Portal, accessible at

https://trustonline.justice.gov.za/Masters/ Account/Login?ReturnUrl=%2fMasters%2f \_MastersTrustsOnline%2fTrustRegister. Only trustees are authorised to record the data on the online portal. However, the authority to upload the beneficial ownership data on behalf of a trustee can be granted to a representative under a Power of Attorney from the trustees.

The accounting officer of the trust is also required to upload the beneficial ownership register with the South African Revenue Services when submitting the tax returns for the Trust.

#### **Consequences of Non-Compliance**

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in a penalty of up to R10 million and/or five years' imprisonment for trustees. Additional sanctions may be imposed by the Master or the Financial Intelligence Centre.



In today's investment climate, capital and asset allocation are mission critical.

Over diversified portfolios will never outperform the benchmark because, to all intents and purposes, they are the entire market, impersonating managed portfolios, but accompanied by high fees that erode performance and returns.

To protect themselves against market risks, investors need to be diversified, but not too diversified or they won't see any significant

return. Diversification has pros and cons. It is possible to enjoy the benefits of diversification without diluting performance.

The trick is to be invested in different currencies and countries in a focussed way: a wide spread is not advisable

More than 90% of a portfolio's return stems from the capital allocation decision. Asset classes to consider include the US dollar, gold, other dollars, and different currencies, countries and industries. Exposure to offshore equities is essential because of the limited opportunities offered by the JSE, and to track global growth themes not available on the local bourse. In recent years the number of listed companies on the JSE has shrunk significantly, providing investors with a limited pool of businesses in which to invest. Making the situation even worse is that few new companies are being listed.

A balanced portfolio should have an allocation to safe-haven assets such as the Swiss Franc and gold, because capital preservation is critically important. The equity components need to perform well because from a return point of view they carry the entire portfolio.

Sadly, South Africa is not an important investment destination. Rising public debt, lack of decisive plans to grow the economy, electricity supply problems and rolling blackouts and sluggish legal processes to address corruption in state-owned enterprises are some of the reasons why capital does not flow into the country. And without investment South Africa will battle to stage an economic recovery and its unemployment figures will continue to soar.


