

Edmund Hillary

Edmund Hillary was probably best known for being the first person, together with Sherpa, Tenzing Norgay, to reach the summit of Mount Everest in the Himalayas. However, he gained many notable achievements in his life-time. He was born in Auckland New Zealand in 1919. His father was an apiaririst and so to was Edmund, tending thousands of bee-hives. He started mountaineering when he was 16

He started mountaineering when he was 16 years old. In 1948, he climbed Mount Cook, New Zealands highest mountain.

During World War 2, he joined the NZ Roayal Air Force and was stationed mainly in the Solomon Islands and Fiji, where he met with an accident and was badly burnt.





Mount Everest

The first attempt to climb Everest was in 1921 by a team from Britain. There had been ten major expeditions and two 'lunatic' solo attempts. Hillary had two reconnaissance expeditions in 1951 and 52. John Hunt who led the 1953 attempt, sponsored by the Joint Himalayan Committee of the Alpine Club of Great Britain and the Royal Geographical Society, asked Hillary to join them. The expedition consisted of 400 people, including 362 porters, 20 Sherpa guides with 4500 kg of baggage. This was the 9th British expedition to Everest. Hunt chose 2 pairs to attempt the Final Climb. Hillary was paired with Sherpa mountaineer Tenzing Norgay. The one pair had to give up due to exhaustion and altitude. Tenzing and Hillary made it to the summit (29028ft –8848m) on 29th May 1953. Hillary had carried 27kg pack – a heavy load at sea level, let alone at that rarefied atmosphere.

The Conquest of Everest was announced to the British on the eve of the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth, and was considered a gift to the Queen from New Zealand to commemorate her Coronation. Hillary was knighted by the Queen shortly thereafter.



ctic Expedition. 1955-8


The Commonwealth Trans Antarctic Expedition. 1955-8 Participating countries: UK; NZ; Australia; SA.

In 1955, Hillary was asked to lead the New Zealand contingent, Sir Vivian Fuchs was overall leader who was planning to make the first Trans Antarctica Crossing of the Antarctic Continent. In the summer of 1955-6, Hillary helped Fuchs to establish the Shackleton Base just inland from where Shackleton had hoped to land at Vahsel Bay to make a crossing.





The RAF also established South Ice Base advance base 440km inland from Shackleton Base (marked as 'Depot' on the envelope). The next summer, Hillary established Scott Base on Ross Island on the opposite side of the Continent --- this base still serve the NZ Antarctic research teams. 22 men overwintered art Scott Base and thereafter established supply depots for Fuchs' crossing. He completed the task and he, with 3 others made a dash for the South Pole with modified Massey Ferguson Tractors. They reached the Pole on 4th January 1958 and were the first to do so since Robert Scott, making Hillary the third person to reach the South Pole by travelling overland. He reached the Pole 16 days before Fuchs, which was considered arrogant by some. The success of the whole venture overshadowed any ill-feeling.



Later Exploits and Ventures

Hillary climbed 10 other peaks in the Himalayas by 1965. Although his Everest and Antarctica were greatly respected, it was his subsequent humanitarian work which made him NZ most revered person.

He became aware of the need for humanitarian aid in the Everest region of Nepal which was home to the Sherpas. He commenced this work in 1960 through his Himalayan Trust Fund, and over decades, until his death in 2008, he was credited with much infrastructure in this remote region of Nepal. He completed over 27 schools, 2 hospitals, 12 clinics, numerous bridges and roads and an airfield. In 2003 he was made an honorary citizen of Nepal.

In 1977, he led a jet boat expedition 'Ocean to Sky' from the mouth of the Ganges to its source. It was during the steep climb to the source that Hillary experienced his first ever debilitating altitude sickness.

In 1985, he was appointed as the NZ High Commissioner to India, Nepal and Bangladesh. He was based in New Delhi for 4 and ½ years.

Also in 1985, he was invited to be part of a 4 man team to fly in a ski plane across Canada to the North Pole. One of the team was Neil Armstrong. He said, he had only seen the North Pole from the Moon so, was excited to see what it look like from ground level. They flew from Edmonton to Ellesmere Island, Northern Canada, riding along in a tiny Otter twin engine airplane. The weather was good so they seized their opportunity, crammed back into their plane, and set off for the North Pole. On April 6, 1985, they touched down at the North Pole. Now safely at the top of the world, they popped a bottle of champagne, which froze solid before even two glasses were poured. With this Hillary became the first person to stand at both poles, as well as the summit of Everest.





In 1995, he received the highest British civilian award – the Most Noble Order of The Garter.




A classical treat and honour for Amberfield!

The Two Grannies a true story

Pauline Platten (the future Mrs Dalton) and I first met in Vanderbijlpark in the 1970s. We were teenagers at the time and began to meet at parties & discos (and pubs!!!) Our families took a very different route to get to Vanderbijl.

The Daltons with four boys arrived in Vanderbijlpark in the mid-1960s from Messina, now called Musina (Limpopo Province). My Dad, a doctor for the Messina Mining Co took a transfer to the Iscor Medical Benefit. The Plattens immigrated to South Africa in 1972. They came from Hartlepool when Mr Platten was recruited by Iscor, the giant iron & steel works in Vanderbijlpark. The family consisted of three girls and two boys.

By the end of the 1970s Pauline and I married. To make it easy for our son to distinguish between the two Grannies, we decided a fun way would be naming them after their respective dogs. So my Mom was called Granny Peggy, after her slobbering Boxer (not to suggest for a moment that my Mom was a slobberer!)

Now as it happened, the Platten's Alsatian was called Satan, and not because of his dark features either! Living next door to a Pastor, Mr Platten was peeved when he noticed that his neighbour beat his wife and kids, even on the day of rest!!! So when the family obtained their dog, Mr Platten a no-nonsense Yorkshireman, named it after Lucifer himself.

Initially the Pastor's head would pop up above the boundary wall whenever Satan was called. Miraculously the beatings stopped. Being called Satan the man of the cloth must have had some sort of "Damascus-like experience". This then is the story behind Granny Satan's nickname.

Our son would call out "Mom who are we visiting today ... Granny Peggy or Granny Satan?"

In the district with Basil a true story

Basil, a very proud ex-farmer, would impress upon this point at every opportunity. As subject inspectors my colleagues and I would visit and advise schools, throughout the province. This story is based on my work experience in the field as a subject inspector in the late 1980s. I was based in Pietermaritzburg.

Typically our job included working in rural areas. Four of us usually travelled together sharing two cars. On one such occasion we found ourselves visiting schools along the South Coast. Anxious about getting home before dark, we debated the quickest route back to Maritzburg, hoping to avoid rush hour on the Highways.

It was at this point that Basil piped up, "Guys, not to worry. I have farmed in the district for twenty years," he announced, rocking back on his heels. "These country districts are like my backyard ... I know a shortcut through the district on dirt ..." He gibed, "You city boys must learn to travel on dirt roads as well, you know!"

The other two opted to rather chance the highway. As Basil and I went along, Basil gave me a history of the district. Every piece of local yarn was concluded with the exclamation, "I'm very well-known in the district. After all I farmed here for over twenty years, you know!"

After a few hours dusty travel, brought the guided tour to a narrow one-lane country bridge. Crossing the bridge was no easy feat mind you, as a flock of sheep was being driven across it just ahead of the car. As we approached the bridge, the sheep, becoming aware of the vehicle, stopped, turned around to look, and let out a chorus of, "Baaaasils!!!" Whereupon, tongue in cheek I retorted, "Gosh ... You are well known in the district Basil!" I got a glower so I dared not say

One of the most common questions posed to conveyancers by both sellers and purchasers of properties, (and sometimes for other property related matters as well) is **who is entitled to appoint the conveyancer**. There is possibly more misinformation out in the marketplace about this issue than any other issue.

Like any other aspect of the agreement of sale, the appointment of a conveyancer to deal with the registration of a transfer is a contractual matter to be negotiated between the purchaser and the seller. Just as neither the purchaser nor the seller can unilaterally dictate terms and conditions of an agreement of sale to the other party, so the appointment of a conveyancer is equally negotiable. The seller is perfectly at liberty to stipulate that the appointment of a conveyancer nominated by the seller is a non-negotiable term, in which event the purchaser will have to either abide by this term or will alternatively have to purchase a different property. Likewise, a purchaser would be entitled to impose a similar term, and, if the seller were not in agreement with the purchaser's instance / nomination, then the seller will simply have to find another purchaser – or, if the seller is desperate for the sale to proceed, will have back down. Likewise, the purchaser may have to back down.

There is a common misconception that in Kwa Zulu-Natal the purchaser has a "right" to appoint the conveyancer. This view is based on a misinterpretation of a Supreme Court case going back many years, which is often misunderstood by many parties in the property industry. The case concerned involved the issue of the appointment of a conveyancer, and the Court held that if the appointment of the conveyancer to attend to the registration of a transfer was not an issue, at the time the agreement of sale was concluded, and if the parties had not either expressly or impliedly indicated their desire to appoint the conveyancer, then in that event, and in only that event, the purchaser, in Kwa Zulu-Natal, is entitled to nominate the conveyancer. This does not of course mean that the purchaser has this enviable right.

A property practitioner, who is paid a commission for brokering a successful sale agreement, may not in any way, directly or indirectly, influence either the seller or purchaser to use a specific conveyancer. A property practitioner guilty of this conduct may have to pay back the commission earned on the deal.







Money History a brief look....

A significant amount of evidence establishes that many things were traded in ancient markets that could be described as an exchange; these included livestock and grain as well as 'pretty' things Due to the complexities of ancient history it has not been possible to trace the true origin of the invention of money, there are many interpretations. Various metals were used in the barter system, so perhaps as it became formalised it became a monetary system...

The Romans use of bronze while not among the most ancient examples, is well documented, and likewise ancient Sparta minted coins from iron to discourage its citizens from engaging in foreign trade. In the early 17th century Sweden lacked precious metals, and so produced 'plate money' large slabs of copper 50 cm or more in length and width, stamped with indications of their value.

Paper money was introduced in Song dynasty in China during the 11th century but the development of the banknote began in the 7th century, with local issues of paper currency. Its roots were in merchant receipts of deposit during the Tang dynasty (618-907), because merchants and wholesalers wanted to avoid the heavy bulk of copper coinage in large commercial transactions. The Song government had run out of copper to make new coins, and issued the first generally circulating notes, named Jiaozi. These notes were a promise by the ruler to redeem them later for some other object of value, the jiaozi did not replace coins, but was used alongside. The central government soon observed the economic advantages of printing paper money, and by the early 12th century, the banknotes issued in a single year amounted to 26 million strings of cash coins.

In the 13th century, paper money became known in Europe through the accounts of travellers, Marco Polo's account of paper money during the Yuan dynasty is the subject of a chapter of his book, 'The Travels of Marco



Spiced Apple Dessert Scones

Ingredients Serves 4

1 cup self-raising flour 1/2 tbsp caster sugar Pinch of salt 30g butter, chilled, chopped 1/3 cup buttermilk Buttermilk, extra, for brushing 1 small granny smith apple, peeled, cored, thinly sliced

1/3 cup brown sugar

1/2 tsp mixed spice

Method

Preheat oven to 220C/200C fan-forced. Line a baking tray with baking paper. Position oven rack in the top half

Sift flour, sugar and salt into a bowl. Add butter. Using fingertips, rub butter into flour mixture until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.

Make a well in centre of mixture. Add buttermilk. Using a flat-bladed knife, stir until a sticky dough forms. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead gently until just smooth.

Using a lightly floured rolling pin, gently roll dough out until 2cm thick. Using a 7cm round cutter, cut out scones. Press leftover dough together. Repeat to make 4

Arrange apple in base of four 1/2 cup-capacity ramekins. Sprinkle with sugar and spice. Place scones in ramekins on top of sugar mixture. Brush tops with extra buttermilk. Place ramekins on tray. Bake for 10 minutes or until light golden and sugar is bubbling around edge. Set aside for 4 minutes before turning out onto plates.

Serve scones with whipped cream, double thick cream, butter or mascarpone. Dip cutters into flour between cutting to prevent dough sticking to them. Make sure rolling pin is lightly floured before use. All scones are cooked on a baking tray lined with baking paper.

You've not had roast pork until you've had roast pork from an air fryer. it's prepped in 5 minutes and on the table in an hour - and that crackling is something else!

AW TY COOKING

What's the best way to cook pork belly in an air fryer?

The trick is to use two different cooking times. Firstly, start high to get that crackling nice and crisp - just how pork crackling should be! Then cook it lower so the pork retains its juiciness without the meat drying out. What we're aiming for here is dry crackling skin, but perfectly moist pork meat underneath.

There's no need to boil or par-boil your pork first before adding it to the air fryer with this method, making it quicker and easier.

INGREDIENTS

Serves 4

1kg Pork Belly Roast Boneless, rind scored (see note)

2 tsp sea salt flakes Olive oil spray

METHOD

Note: If time permits, place pork on a tray, uncovered, in the fridge for up to 2 days to dry the rind out.

Preheat the air fryer to 200°C for 3 minutes. Pat pork dry with paper towel. Rub salt into pork rind.

Place the pork in the air fryer basket and spray with oil. Set timer for 25 minutes and cook until the rind crackles. Reduce temperature to 160°C. Set timer for 30 minutes and cook until pork is tender and cooked through.

Notes:

If pork starts to over-brown during cooking, cover with foil.



Add apple sauce of the freshest kind as an accompaniment.

Apple sauce

Makes 1 1/2 cups

INGREDIENTS

2 medium granny smith apples, peeled, cored, chopped

1 tbsp caster sugar

1/4 tsp mixed spice

1 tbsp lemon juice

METHOD

Place apple, sugar, mixed spice, lemon juice and 1/4 cup cold water in a saucepan over medium heat. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer, covered, for 10 minutes or until apple is tender.

Transfer mixture to a food processor. Process until smooth. Season with salt and pepper.

NOTES

Serve with pork cutlets, roast pork or glazed ham. Suitable to freeze in an air tight container for up to 2 months. Reheat in a small saucepan over low heat.



WHY IS MY DOG ITCHING?



ith warmer weather creeping in, you might find your dog itching more often. There are many causes of a dog's itchy skin, so it can be very tricky to determine what the origin is. The two main things that give a dog itchy skin are pests and allergies, both of which can be seasonal. 2. Food Allergies

Just like people, dogs can be allergic to just about anything. If you don't find any fleas or ticks and your dog still has itchy skin, you might be dealing with an allergy of some sort. Food allergies, while rare, do happen and eliminating foods can prove necessary to find out what ingredient(s) your dog is allergic to. You can work with us to guide you on the process of seeing if any of these food allergens are triggering your pet's allergy.

3. Environmental Allergies

If your dog is still itching, but he doesn't have fleas or a food allergy, he may have some environmental allergies to things like pollen. There are therapeutic foods to improve your dog's skin health and aid in protecting them from these environmental allergens.

Depending on the severity of your dog's itchiness, treatment can range from minor to extensive, going beyond just one method. Simple oral medication might be ideal during the worst parts of the year, along with regular grooming and medicated shampoos. Desensitization "allergy injections" may help too. Of course, steroid injections and stronger medications are suggested if your dog's itching persists. Regardless of the cause, a consult with a vet is vital before taking matters into your own hands.

When to visit us at Midlands Vet?

As we have covered, there are many reasons your dog might be itching, but the two most common ailments are pests and allergies. Regardless of the reason, seek advice when you first notice your dog itching. Don't give any medications prior to your visit to the vet. Although the treatment might be quick and simple, the last thing you want is to make a decision that causes its own adverse reaction. Whereas fleas and ticks are best treated with prevention (which can be purchased in a variety of forms), food allergies are treated with limited-ingredient foods to eradicate the offending ingredient. Environmental allergies are tougher to treat, but can be easily managed.

At the end of the day, keeping your dog happy and healthy and itchiness at bay is important. There's nothing a little tender loving care and veterinary treatment can't fix. Soon enough, you'll find your dog comfortable and back to normal.


